Vanco Automated Giving

In 2022 almost 20% of all financial contributions to Our Shepherd were completed using our Vanco on-line giving program, that is really impressive considering we have not been offering that option for very long! It is also really helpful in that it provides a consistent income stream all year long. 




CHANGES IN OUTDOOR MINISTRY



Continuing To Show Our Love

Moving into February and approaching Valentine's Day causes me to wonder how Jesus might react to this holiday. If we look back in history, this holiday does indeed have some Christian origins. The details are a little foggy and can be disputed, but it does seem it is safe to say there were a couple of individuals named Valentine perhaps as early as the third century of Christianity who were martyred after expressing love and care for



a variety of individuals. The actions of these martyrs do seem to line up with Jesus' teachings and there is a theory of the Church declaring February 14th as being a day of remembrance for these martyred saints named Valentine. There are also theories of the holiday being tied to a Pagan fertility celebration and of course in our lifetime, businesses like florists and greeting cards have really done an aggressive job of marketing the holiday.

I think we could support an argument of Jesus endorsing a holiday that ultimately promotes the principles Jesus proclaimed in Mark 12:28-31, ²⁸ ... He came over and asked him, "Which commandment is the most important of all?" ²⁹ Jesus replied, "The most important one is Israel, listen! Our God is the one Lord, ³⁰ and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your mind, and with all your strength. ^[a] ³¹ The second is this, You will love your neighbor as yourself. ^[b] No other commandment is greater than these."

In other words, if indeed we take an opportunity at Valentine's Day to practice what Jesus declared, then I think we are moving in the right direction. As a community, we do this really well in many ways. Our constant support of the food pantry and the birthday cake kits we assemble for the pantry are a great example. Or the meals we are creating for the Salvation Army, or the projects our Sunday School students distribute, or the simple actions of providing a space and time for the sharing of a cup of coffee on a Wednesday morning are all ways we can live out Jesus' commandments and celebrate Valentine's Day not just one day out of the year but all of the time.

Valentine's Day is indeed a great opportunity to pause and be intentional about expressing our love to someone special in our lives, but it is also a great time to intentionally think about how we might be living out Jesus' Greatest Commandment every day out of the year.
