

In the past couple of weeks there have been multiple times when I have been working in my office and there are others doing lots of other things in the building. We are making chili, cutting tortes, creating meals, and leading children on their faith journeys. In other words, doing the work of the church.

In the midst of all of that work, I know there are also conversations occurring. I know there is laughter shared and honestly some genuine tears shared in some tender moments. That is all part of the work of the church also. It is important to share with others both our laughter and our tears, it is what affirms our humanity and honestly a large part of what gives us hope for tomorrow. This sharing allows us to help carry one another's burdens and to recognize what we personally are experiencing is really not that different than the rest of humanity. Over the past two years, when the pandemic kept us apart, I believe this is a large part of what we were missing in our lives. The ability to look each other in the eye as we are laughing and crying.

I believe isolation may indeed be necessary when we have an illness running rapid, but I also believe we need to recognize that this isolation comes at a cost. I believe we should also recognize the significant value of something we do without even being intentional about it. We are intentional about gathering and performing the official work, but let's also celebrate the ministry that we are performing in the laughter and in the tears that are a by-product of our work. So, the next time you are part of a crew preparing a meal, or setting up for an event, or whatever else needs to happen; take the time to check in with each other. Share the laughter and the concern, acknowledge our shared humanity.
