All items MUST be clean, dry and empty. Please leave items in the church office. Plastic bags can be placed in the container in the choir room. Thank you.





#### **PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

As I am writing this, the weather forecast is calling for our first substantial frost overnight. Considering we are about a week away from November, that seems a little late in the year to me. This has felt like a particularly dry and warm fall, which has been really nice, but it is also fooling me into thinking we are still a long way away from the holidays. In case you are in the same place as I am, I need to tell you we are less than five weeks from Thanksgiving and less than nine weeks from Christmas. If you are in a position in life where you do not need to plan ahead, then maybe that doesn't matter much, but if you are like me and need to be looking ahead, the holidays can sneak up on you really quick.



I don't know about you, but when things sneak up on me, I tend to be much more reactionary and less intentional. In the rush and chaos, it is easy for me to miss the little things of abundance and beauty in our world. These are the same things we should be intentionally thankful for as we approach the Thanksgiving holiday. The origins of Thanksgiving have its roots in being intentionally thankful during challenging times. Looking back in history, the first official proclamation of Thanksgiving was by Abraham Lincoln on October 3rd, 1863. It should be noted this was just a couple months after the Battle of Gettysburg, a time of deep national divide, and clearly a challenging time for countless. In response to these conditions, Lincoln believed there was value in intentionally reflecting on what the nation had to be grateful for. Lincoln was able to see hope and reason for perseverance even in the most trying of times and anchored those beliefs in a spirit of thankfulness.

In our world today I believe there are also reasons to be grateful and there is value to be intentional about it. A person doesn't always need to find grandiose, or earth-shattering things, sometimes I think it is maybe more valuable to find something each and every day. I am grateful for the wide palette colors in our trees this time of year. I am grateful for cool nights and crisp mornings. I am grateful for a warm house and full kitchen cupboards. I am grateful for being part of a congregation striving to authentically live into their faith. What are you thankful for?

Go ahead, try it, what are you thankful for today? And when you can do that for multiple days, how about finding something every time you sit down for a meal, or whatever else you find yourself doing multiple times a day. An attitude of thankfulness can do amazing things for the human spirit!
